

CITIZENSHIP AND RESIDENCE BY INVESTMENT

Module Overview

The module starts with an examination of the history of the industry with a focus on modern developments that started in the 1980's. The module culminates with a thorough review and assessment of the arguments for and against investment migration. The views of politicians, scholars and media commentators are assessed.

- Discussion on why the concept of investment migration can be controversial.
- What is meant by citizenship, residence, and domicile?
- The different ways citizenship can be acquired (ius soli, ius naturali and ius doni)
- The rights and privileges associated with Citizenship and Residency by Investment acquisition
- The merits and criticisms of the concept and use of Investment Migration programmes.
